Welcome GTFRC Families and Happy Fall!



Kitchen Corner

Sweet Potato Soup

- 1 sm onion
- 2 stalks celery
- 6 cups chicken stock
- 2 lg. sweet potatoes (peeled and chopped)
- 1/2 tsp nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1 tbsp olive oil

Cooking Instructions: Saute onions and celery in oil until soft. Add balance of ingredients. Bring to boil then simmer for 25mins or until potatoes are tender. Remove from heat in small batches Puree. Return to sauce pan. Heat and Serve. Option—put 1/2 lb fried bacon pieces in it.
